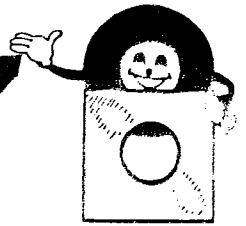

KRC E C O REVIEW D

Drive-In Guitars, Jerry MacNeish, Rockhouse Records LP8803, Bachstraat 6-2421 TS Nieuwkoop- Holland, 1988

From the moment you first see the album cover you know it's going to be good - it's got to be good, with the catchy title, variety of selections and cover layout. Dropping the needle on the platter for the first time confirmed my feelings.

Jerry MacNeish, long time loyal follower of surf instrumentals, remains loyal in his recreation of these classic selections. Jerry has freshened up these great tunes ala' 1980's, without losing the original flavor.

For the most part, today's music lacks a quality Jerry mentioned in his own liner notes - sincerity. Drum machines and synthesized music don't have the same feel, and down to earth quality that music of the 60's and early 70's had. Now, Jerry has brought it back.

While listening to the disc, it became increasingly difficult to tell Jerry's cover versions from the original ones done over 20 years

ago. My only giveaway was that some of my originals are scratchy and also not in stereo.

This album contains a generous supply (16 songs - compared to 10 or 11 these days) of tunes that will please surf instrumental enthusiasts. The songs were all recorded in 1987 with one done in late 1986. Selections include: Walk Don't Run, Changing Tides (both Ventures); Mr. Rebel, (Eddie & The Showmen); Misirlou, Let's Go Trippin', and Surf Beat (all Dick Dale); Las Vegas Scene (Wes Dakus); Pipeline (Chantays); Wipeout (Surfaris); Penetration/ Outer Limits Medley (Pyramids/ Marketts); Mr. Moto (Bel Airts); Surf Party, Baja (The Astronauts); Rumble at Waikiki (recent John Blair composition); and two Bobby Fuller Four compositions before their big vocal hits, Stringer and Our Favorite Martian.

This Baltimore native has outdone himself on his second album, a project he funded himself. The sound quality and pressing is great, the music fantastic and the selections appropriate. Liner notes from Jerry (not identified) and Don Risnick (author of "Nothin' But Instrumentals") tie the package together.

Although pressed on a foreign label (Holland), I hope a U.S. company takes the initiative to press, promote and distribute this album. It's one that is a necessary ingredient to any surf instrumental collector's collection.

ARE YOU AWARE????????

- At the September KRC Business meeting, a great deal of items were discussed and voted upon. First it was decided that from now on business meetings will be held after every show at 5 PM at Bully's Restaurant, corner of 8th (Route 462) and Union Streets. Social hour is from 4 - 5 PM. Three motions were made, discussed and approved:

MOTION # 1: Due to the enormous work load put upon the Marketmaster at any given show, the person in that position would receive two table spaces at no charge.

MOTION # 2: People joining the club after September 1st of any given year will no longer be carried over with membership into the next year. Instead, there will be a membership fee for the last four months of the year at 50% of the current rate.

MOTION # 3: As an inducement to attend business meetings, the club will cover all meal gratuities at all 10 of our monthly after-show meetings. These policies will go into effect immediately.

- In an effort to bring officer elections into synch with the calendar year, we are moving back the nomination process. Those people interested in running for President, Vice President, Secretary or Treasurer need to submit their intention, or be nominated at the December 4th Business meeting. - The Guinness Book of Records people would be pleased with this one. We broke our all time number of dealers at our September show. On Sunday the 11th, we had 58 people set up displaying and selling records. This calculates out to almost a QUARTER OF A MILLION RECORDS OR RELATED ITEMS! Not bad for a town that boasts a population of 11,237!
- KRC received great mentions in an article that appeared on an inside section front page of the Reading Times. The article was covering the July 10th Record Show put on by the Berks County Park and Recreation Department outside at Grings Mill Recreation area. The majority of the folks set up were KRC members.

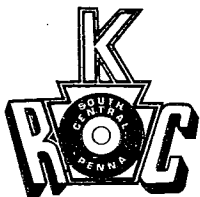
